Features rise of the dragon, land and sea beast, and Babylon

Seven bowls (all) 15.1 – 16.21

Throne room 16.18-21: "flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder, and a violent earthquake...and huge hailstones..."

Isaiah 6 elements Found in Revelation 4:1-8

- Is. 6:1 Lord on a throne (Rev. 4:2b)
- Is. 6:2 seraphs with 6 wings (Rev 4:8)
- Is. 6:2 Seraphs sing, "Holy, holy, holy Lord of hosts" (Rev. 4:8b)

Ezekiel 1 elements Found in Revelation 4:1-8

- Ez. 1:5 Four living creatures (Rev 4:6)
- Ez. 1:6 Four wings (not 6), four faces (not 1) see Rev. 4:7-8
- Ez. 1:10 The faces were of human, lion, ox, eagle (Rev. 4:7)
- Ez. 1:13b Lightning from the fire (Rev. 4:5)
- Ez. 1:18 Rims are full of eyes (Rev. 4:8)
- Ez. 1:24 Thunder of the Almighty (Rev. 4:5)
- Ez. 1:28 Splendor like a rainbow (Rev. 4:3b)

Numbers in Revelation:

7 – Seven Churches in Asia-minor

12 – example: 24 elders around the throne (4:4)

Thrones and Theophany

Theophany means a manifestation of God. See Ezekiel 1 and Exodus 19:16-25

Exodus 19:16-25 – there is thunder and lightning, a thick cloud, blast of a trumpet, smoke and fire, God answered in thunder.

Revelation 4:5 – flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder, flaming torches

Revelation 8:5 – peals of thunder, rumblings, flashes of lightning, and an earthquake




Seal Five and Six:

- Seal 5 "How Long, O Lord?" (6:10) Those who had been slaughtered for the word of God
- Seal 6 "Who is able to stand?" (6:17) The world is turned upside down in judgment

Chapter 7 – The Great Tribulation

"These are they who have come out of the great tribulation (ordeal)"
-Revelation 7:14

"Come out" indicated a continual process - they are 'coming out' over a period of time

"Tribulation" in Greek – 'thlipseos'

Revelation 1:9 "I, John, your brother who share with you in Jesus the **persecution** and the kingdom and the patient endurance, was on the island called Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus."

Revelation 2:10 "Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Beware, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison so that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have **affliction**. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life."

Seal Seven: Silence

"When the Lamb opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven for about half an hour."

-Revelation 8:1

- Zephaniah 1:7 "Be silent before the Lord God! For the day of the Lord is at hand."
- Habakkuk 2:20, "But the Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him!"
- Zechariah 2:13, "Be silent, all people, before the Lord; for he has roused himself from his holy dwelling."
